



Fact Sheet: Planned Parenthood's 2017-18 Annual Report¹

Planned Parenthood's Financials

- During fiscal year 2017-18, Planned Parenthood reported a **record income of \$1.67 billion² -- a 14% increase over the previous year.**
 - Nearly \$631 million came from private contributions.³
 - Taxpayer funding in the form of government grants, contracts, and Medicaid reimbursements increased from \$543.7 million the previous year to **\$563.8 million, or more than \$1.5 million per day⁴**— nearly **34% of Planned Parenthood's overall revenue.**⁵
 - Planned Parenthood's taxpayer funding has **increased more than 55% in the last 10 years.**⁶
 - Planned Parenthood reported **nearly \$1.9 billion in net assets** and **excess revenue more than doubled from \$98.5 million the previous year to 244.8 million.**⁷

Abortions and Non-abortion Services: Change from Last Year and Long-term Trends

- Planned Parenthood **performed 332,757 abortions⁸** in 2017-18 – an increase of more than 11,000 from the previous year – and **more than 3 million abortions** (3,280,520)⁹ over the past 10 reported years (2008-18).
- The number of unique patients (2.4 million) remained constant from the previous report, while the number of abortions increased.
- In 2017-18, **abortions made up 96% of Planned Parenthood's pregnancy resolution services** (no change), while prenatal services, miscarriage care, and adoption referrals accounted for only 2.6% (9,055), 0.5% (1,731) and 0.8% (2,831), respectively.¹⁰
- **For every adoption referral in 2017-18, Planned Parenthood performed more than 117 abortions.**¹¹ Over the past 10 reported years, the ratio was approximately 148 abortions for every adoption referral.¹²
- According to data from Planned Parenthood's own annual reports¹³, over the last 10 years:
 - Total services are **down 11.5%.**
 - With changing practice guidelines,¹⁴ total cancer screening and prevention services have **dropped by nearly 67%**, including declines of more than **64% for breast exams** and **70% for pap tests.**
 - Prenatal services are **down nearly 78% from their peak in 2009.**
 - Contraceptive services are **down more than 31%.**

- Unique patients have **dropped by 600,000 – a 20% decline.**
- Approximately **240 (29%) of Planned Parenthood facilities have closed their doors.**
